Undefended Divorce

An undefended divorce is one in which you and your spouse have agreed to obtain a divorce and neither of you formally object to the divorce. It also implies that there is sufficient evidence of the irretrievable breakdown of your marriage.

If you decide to instruct us on this basis you will receive the following from us:

1. A clear and simple explanation of the requirements and process;
2. All your divorce paperwork prepared for the court and taken care of;
3. Advice from an experienced divorce and family solicitor;
4. Communication from your solicitor by email and telephone.

You will need to provide us with your original marriage certificate and your spouse's address for service of the petition.

Fixed fee

You will pay a fixed fee of £1,500 (inclusive of VAT at 20% and court fees of £385).

This will cover your costs of divorce to obtaining Decree Absolute but does not include sorting out a financial agreement or children issues.

Court fees

Your court fees are included in the £1,500.

Additional fees

In the majority of cases the divorce can proceed without any difficulty. If there are unusual aspects, such as being unable to trace your spouse, or your spouse not acknowledging receipt of the divorce papers, then we would need to charge you extra for this.

If you need advice on reaching a financial settlement with your spouse or advice on arrangements for your children this will involve additional work which your solicitor will explain to you if requested and you will be provided with a separate estimate of costs for this.
