Undefended Respondent Dissolution of Civil Partnership

An undefended Respondent dissolution of civil partnership is one where you have received or are about to receive an application for dissolution from your civil partner and you do not wish to object to it going through.

If you decide to instruct us on this basis you will receive the following from us:

1. Assistance in replying to dissolution papers that you may have received;
2. Your dissolution paperwork prepared and taken care of;
3. Advice from an experienced family solicitor;
4. Communication with your solicitor by email and telephone;
5. A solicitor who explains the process to you in simple terms

Fixed fee

You will pay £700 (inclusive of VAT).

This fee includes the following:

1. Up to an hour's discussion with you by phone, email or in person;
2. A review of the documents received by you and an explanation of their implications;
3. Completion of the necessary acknowledgement of service to be sent to the court;
4. A letter to the Applicant/Applicant's solicitors dealing with the costs of the dissolution as usually the person starting the dissolution will request the Respondent to pay the costs of it. It is usual for the Respondent to make a contribution towards these costs and we will help you to negotiate this.

Additional fees

There will be additional costs in any of these circumstances if:

- A dispute arises with regard to your contribution towards the Applicant's costs;
- You do not agree with the contents of the application and would like us to prepare and file with the court your statement of views;
- The Applicant does not apply for Final Order and sufficient time has elapsed for you to be able to do so;
